### The ACT® Test Reports

In the table below, you will find a description and delivery date for the types of ACT reports you will receive.

Type	Report	Description	Delivery Date
<b>Student Level Reporting for the ACT</b>	ACT Student Report with <i>Using Your ACT Results</i> booklet – paper and online testing	Printed-paper report containing college reportable scores, mailed to the examinees at the address provided in the non-cognitive session.	3-8 weeks following receipt of examinee test responses
	ACT Student Online Scores – paper and online testing	Examinee logs on to <a href="http://www.actstudent.org">www.actstudent.org</a> to access a variety of services through his/her ACT web account. If a student needs to create a new account, the student must enter the ACT ID from the printed score report to view the state scores. <i>Note: Only college reportable scores are available online.</i>	Scores will be available online about one week after the examinee receives the printed score report in the mail
<b>School Level Reporting for the ACT</b>	ACT High School Report (student level score data) – paper and online testing	Printed-paper report containing college reportable scores, mailed to the director of counseling in batches until all reports are delivered.	3-8 weeks following receipt of examinee test responses
	ACT Student Score Labels – paper and online testing	Two (2) printed labels per examinee sent to the director of counseling; used to place college reportable test results on an examinee’s high school transcript/permanent record.	3-8 weeks following receipt of examinee test responses Shipped with ACT High School Report
	ACT High School Check List Report – paper and online testing	List of examinees for whom paper reports and score labels are included in the shipment of college reportable score reports. One (1) paper copy mailed to the director of counseling, reflecting the order in which a group of reports is shipped, alphabetically within grade in school. <i>Note: Checklists are not cumulative.</i>	3-8 weeks following receipt of examinee test responses  Shipped with ACT High School Report
	ACT Non-College Reportable Score Notification Letter – paper testing	Printed letters containing scores achieved using non-college reportable accommodations. <i>Note: These are not college reportable scores. Two copies mailed to the school test coordinator, one copy for the examinee and one copy for the school.</i>	No later than July 24, 2017
	ACT Profile Report – High School – paper and online testing	An aggregate report that provides trends and averages of the high school based on the state-tested grade 11 student population. One copy mailed to the test coordinator. <i>Note: This includes records of examinees who tested with non-college reportable accommodations.</i>	No later than July 24, 2017

<b>District Level Reporting for the ACT</b>	ACT Profile Report – District – paper and online testing	An aggregate report that provides trends and averages of the state based on the state tested grade 11 student population. One copy on CD mailed to the district assessment coordinator. <i>Note: This includes examinees who tested with non-college reportable accommodations.</i>	No later than July 24, 2017
	ACT Student Level Data File – District – paper and online testing	A student data file in CSV format that includes all scores for all examinees for whom ACT processed test responses. One copy on CD mailed to the district assessment coordinator. <i>Note: This includes records of examinees who tested with non-college reportable accommodations. A file layout is provided.</i>	No later than July 24, 2017
<b>College Reporting for the ACT</b>	ACT Student College Report(s) – paper and online testing	College reportable scores are reported to examinees' selected colleges (up to 4). <i>Note: Colleges determine frequency and format of receiving scores (e.g., paper, CD, internet).</i>	3-8 weeks following receipt of examinee test responses
