

About PreACT

PreACT[®], introduced in 2016, is a 10th-grade multiple choice assessment designed to model the ACT[®] test experience, while providing preparation and practice for future ACT test takers. Scores provide students and educators with students' predicted performance on the ACT and help inform high school course decisions. PreACT reporting includes both academic and career indicators, which are designed to identify strengths and areas for improvement, providing a complete view of students' college and career readiness.

Overview

- Short, 10th-grade multiple-choice assessment administered on paper by schools and education organizations
- Available to states, districts, schools, third-party agencies, and gifted-and-talented search programs
- [Results predict performance on the ACT test](#)
- Testing experience simulates that of the ACT testing experience, within a shorter time frame
- Provides current achievement and projected future ACT test scores on the familiar 1–36 score scale
- Students may opt to share their information with colleges and scholarship agencies
- ACT Interest Inventory results provide students with personalized information to guide them in career planning
- Estimated annual test volume: 518,000

What's Tested?

- The PreACT mimics the ACT test by testing the same four subject areas, within a shorter time frame
- Total Testing Time: 2 hours, 10 minutes, with approximately 60 minutes of pre-administration activities
 - English: 45 questions, 30 minutes
 - Mathematics: 36 questions, 40 minutes
 - Reading: 25 questions, 30 minutes
 - Science: 30 questions, 30 minutes
- Test dates and time established by the customer within the annual test window, September 1–June 1 of each school year
- Score reporting turnaround within 5–10 days of receipt of answer documents, allowing for early and effective planning for students and educators
