

Average ACT Scores by State Graduating Class of 2022

The table below classifies states by the percent of ACT-tested high school graduates, including the average Composite score and percent meeting ACT College and Career Readiness Benchmarks by subject.

The best practice is to compare states where the same or similar percentages of graduates were tested (e.g., Alabama 100% and Mississippi 100%, or Minnesota 69% and Missouri 66%).
