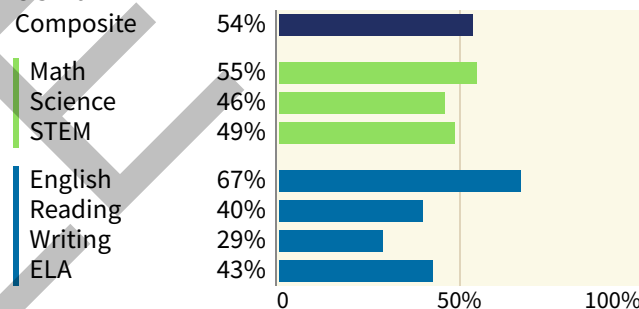

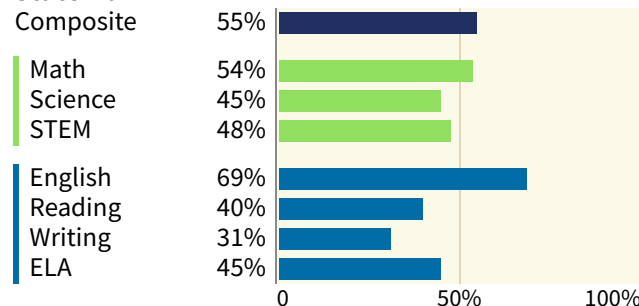
### Ranking Results

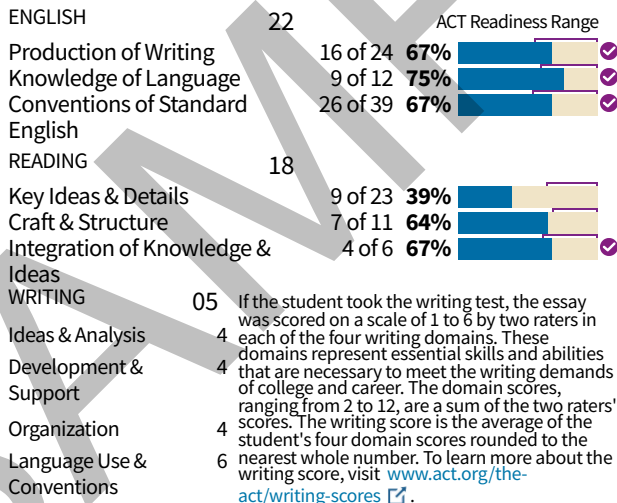
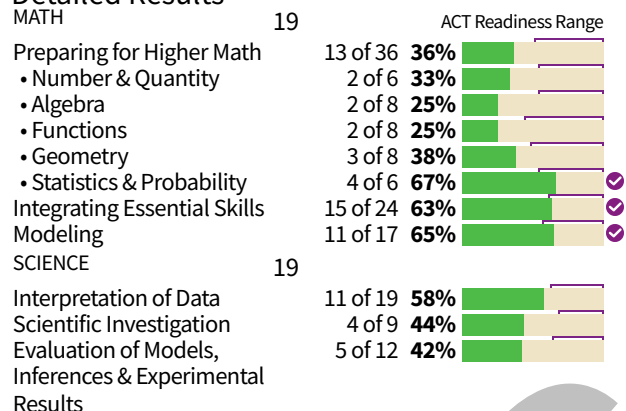
#### US Rank

### Detailed Results



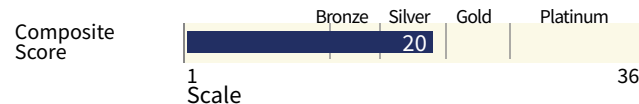
**ACT Composite Score:** Beginning with all ACT tests taken in September 2025, the Composite score is the average of the math, English, and reading scores. For most ACT tests taken prior to September 2025, the Composite score also includes the science score. The Composite score is not computed when any of the test scores that contribute to it are missing. With the exception of writing, all test scores range from 1 to 36.

**ACT Readiness Range:** This range shows where a student who has met the ACT College Readiness Benchmark on this subject test would typically perform.

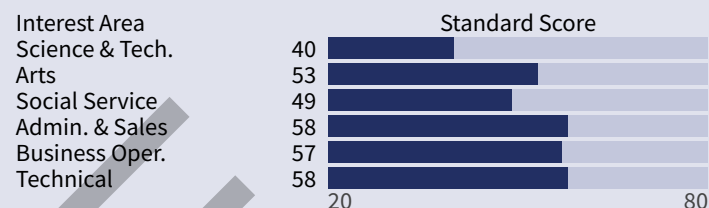

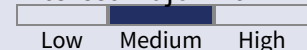
