MyACT Instructions for Students

ACT lets you send your scores—for FREE—to up to FOUR colleges and scholarship programs. Let ACT know where you would like to send your scores, no later than 2 calendar days after taking the ACT. After the deadline, changes may not be reflected on your score report or reported to your score recipients.

Get Ready

- **Verify your information.** Confirm your name is correct at the top of the page. Contact your school's ACT test coordinator if your name is different from what is listed. You will need to get a new form.
- **Review Examinee Terms and Conditions and Privacy Policy.** Go to act.org/info-for-examinees to review the Examinee Terms and Conditions and Privacy Policy with your parent/legal guardian before testing. MyACT account details are available to preview at myactprofile.com.

Get Set

1. **Log in to myact.org.** If you don't have an existing account, you'll need to create one. Make note of your username and password before logging out.
*Note: If you already have an account, don't create a new one. If you do, you may not be able to access your scores. Use the **Forgot User ID?** or **Forgot Password?** links if you need further assistance.*
2. **Select Enter Student Code.** Enter the Student Code shown above.
3. **Make your selections.** Follow the on-screen instructions to provide your information and identify score recipients.
Note: Account information is optional unless noted and may vary by state.
4. **Agree to the terms.** After making your selections, review and agree to the ACT Terms and Conditions. Then return to the home page of your MyACT account.
