A lot of our students are really isolated from outside resources. Some of our towns don't even have gas stations, and many students come from families where higher education isn't always the immediate path.

The Solution: A Holistic Approach with the ACT® Test and ACT® WorkKeys®

USC Schools have implemented a full suite of ACT assessments as a part of their readiness strategy:

- PreACT® in 10th grade gives students early exposure to college readiness testing.
- The ACT test in 11th grade is used not only as a college admissions test but also as a tool to evaluate curriculum needs.
- ACT WorkKeys in 12th grade offers students the opportunity to round out their student journey by measuring real-world, applied skills critical in the workforce.

The Impact: Confidence, Recognition, and Real-World Validation

Each spring, USC Schools administer WorkKeys Assessments to all seniors. The results are revealed during the schools' annual honors banquet, where students who may not typically receive academic accolades are publicly recognized for their WorkKeys National Career Readiness Certificate (NCRC®) achievement. Nearly all students earn WorkKeys certificates. Students beam with joy and great pride from their accomplishments.

Beyond the emotional impact, the data provided by WorkKeys also informs USC's curriculum planning. USC Schools use WorkKeys scores to evaluate and guide instruction. It validates the effectiveness of academic programs in preparing students for life beyond school.

Bridging to Workforce and Postsecondary Success

Widespread adoption of the WorkKeys NCRC is still emerging in Minnesota. However, USC Schools see the value in exposure and preparedness for students. Graduating seniors often find employment in industries that train on the job, such as welding or construction. In those settings, WorkKeys serves as an extra tool in their toolbox — something tangible to showcase their competence. It informs students and employers that they are ready for the job.

Though tracking long-term outcomes is a challenge, USC Schools remain committed to the ACT test and WorkKeys as part of its broader college and career readiness efforts.
